About Francis and Clare

St. Francis of Assisi is perhaps the best-known and most-beloved saint who ever lived. Though he died over eight hundred years ago, he still has a huge following today. Francis was born into a well-to-do family in Italy in 1181. He spent the first few years of his adult life without much of a spiritual focus. However, following a vision in which God urged Francis to "re-build my church," Francis changed his life completely and dedicated himself to serving God and the poor. He soon had a group of other men who wanted to join him. It was not too long before a young noble woman named Clare met Francis and started a similar group for women. Clare became well known in her own right for her similar commitment to simplicity, poverty, and compassion. She too became recognized as a saint and "the Poor Clares" is a movement that also continues to this day.

Francis appeals to a wide range of people because of his profound love for all living creatures, his love of the marginalized, his embrace of Sister Poverty, and his joyful love of God and all of creation. Francis continues to offer wisdom to us today as we seek to live out the Gospel. Francis and Clare's simple messages of charity, joy and caring for creation naturally connects with children. This program seeks to make these values easily available to children and parents.

Following the Way[®] with Francis and Friends is a program with five units:



How This All Works

Francis and Friends is a series of five videos that introduce the program and the four elements of the "Great Commandment" that we should love God with all our Heart, Soul, Mind and Strength. Each video features an animal puppet, a cartoon of Francis and Clare, and Rich Nelson, creator of the Following the Way[®] faith formation programs.

1. Log in at <u>www.francisandfriends.org</u>

Use the password you receive at registration.

2. Choose one of the five units: Introduction, Heart, Soul, Mind or Strength

We suggest you do the Introduction first. After that, the order of the units is up to you.

3. Watch the video for that unit with your child

4. Choose your activities

After watching one of the videos with your child, you will find 10+ downloadable activity sheets for each unit to help you take the lesson you just learned out into the world to experience and explore God's wonderful creation.

5. Chart your progress

Chart your progress on the Passport you create in the Introduction Unit. Once your family completes at least 5 of the 10 activities for each unit, you can tell Francis and Clare you have completed the Heart, Soul, Mind or Strength unit and download a completion certificate.

6. Receive your completion medal

Send a message to Francis and Clare when you get a completion certificate for all four units and within 2-3 weeks and your child will receive a high quality, completion medal and a congratulations note from Francis and Clare in the mail. One medal is included in the purchase price of the program (includes shipping). Medals for additional children can also be purchased for \$10 each.

7. Share the fun

Do You Need to Be a Christian to Use Francis and Friends?

The teachings of Francis and Clare are almost universally admired by people of all faiths. They speak to common human themes of care for others, the kinship of all creation, and the value of a life lived with simplicity and genuine love. This program is created by Christians and Jesus is talked about. However, this is not done in a proselytizing way. We honor the value and inherent worth of every major world religion. We genuinely hope that people of all faiths will enjoy Francis and Friends.

God's Creation is discussed a lot. Is this program Creationist?

No. We speak of God's creation as a way to recognize that God is the source of all life. We do not see a conflict between science and religion and this program does not espouse any particular theory about *how* the world came into being. We focus instead on the relationship between God, humanity, and the rest of nature and our important role as protector of our planet. By seeing all things as "brothers and sisters" as Francis taught, we grow into a deeper appreciation of our mutual source and destiny.

Is There a Meaning to the Logo?

Yes! Glad you asked! Each of the four color quadrants represents one of the four aspects of the Great Commandment to love God with all our Heart, Soul, Mind and Strength. The counter-clockwise rotation indicates that the journey described by Francis (and Clare, Jesus, and others) is countercultural to the values of the individualistic, consumerist society many people live by today. The figures in each of the four quadrants indicate children at play and, when viewed altogether, they form a flower - pointing towards the family faith and nature theme of the program.

What is this other "Following the Way" program about?

Following the Way[®] is the parent program of Francis and Friends. It is designed to enable adults (either in small groups or individually) to further explore the meaning of the Great Commandment in our daily lives. Learn more and discover your spiritual type at
